Symposium Overview

Presentations on Wednesday will feature speakers discussing topics related to recent legislative changes and "Understanding the Fundamentals". The symposium will continue through Thursday, June 26, with an opening keynote presentation from Sujay Kaushal from the University of Maryland. The day continues with talks within the themes of "Collaborative Solutions," "Innovative Technology," and "Future Challenges". Breakfast and lunch buffets will be served in Melodeon Hall. Thursday night dinner will be on your own with several options in nearby Nashville, Indiana.

Friday, June 27, following a breakfast buffet, will feature an introduction to the field trip to Strahl and Ogle dams within Brown County State Park. The Symposium will conclude by lunchtime for ample travel time home.
